The Director General Pakistan Post Office alongwith concerned officers of the Department attended the meeting with Honorable Wafaqi Mohtasib on 08-12-2020 at 12:00 hours in the conference room of Wafaqi Mohtasib Secretariat (WMS) Islamabad. The Honorable Wafaqi Mohtasib chaired the meeting to review the progress on implementation of decisions taken during the last meeting held on 7-10-2020. The following decisions were made in the said meeting:-

- i. Pakistan Post must ensure that the hearings held in the WMS Head Office as well as Regional Offices are attended by the representatives of Pakistan Post at an appropriate level well conversant with the cases and reports against the complaints are also submitted timely to the WMS with a copy to the complainants concerned.
- ii. Ensure that the status of complaints resolved by the PPOD at their own level is timely updated at their system to avoid the automatic transfer of complaints to the CMIS of the WMS after 30 days of registration of such complaints.
- 2. In the meeting, the Director General Pakistan Post Office also stated that the limitation period of 15 days as prescribed under Regulation 12(8) of Wafaqi Mohtasib (Investigation and Disposal of Complaints) Regulations, 2013 is not being observed for hearing notices. Moreover, the complaints relating to service matter are also being entertained which are beyond the Jurisdiction of Wafaqi Mohtasib Secretariat (WMS). The Honorable Wafaqi Mohtasib directed the concerned staff of his secretariat that.
 - i. The hearing notices of the WMS will also be endorsed to the D.G Pakistan Post to ensure that a duly authorized representative is deputed to attend the hearings held in the WMS.
 - ii. The WMS to consider utilizing of the Postal Services for the purpose of dispatch of its mail.
 - iii. The WMS will not assume jurisdiction in complaints regarding service matters of the employees of Pakistan Post.
- 3. All are enjoined upon to ensure strict compliance of the above instructions.



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
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MINUTES OF THE MEETING WITH THE D.G. PAKISTAN POST HELD ON 08.12.2020


A meeting was held under the chairmanship of the Hon'ble Wafaqi Mohtasib (HWM) on 8.12.2020 at 1230 hours in the conference room of the Wafaqi Mohtasib Secretariat to, inter alia, review the progress on implementation of decisions taken during the meeting held on 7th October, 2020 and consider the issue of undue delay in payment of profits to the account holders of Pakistan Post Saving Banks, as well as to exchange views on some other related issues. The meeting started with recitation from the Holy Quran. A list of participants is attached.

- 2. Welcoming the participants, the HWM recalled the decisions taken in the earlier meeting held on 7.10.2020 and stated that it was imperative that those decisions were implemented with the due sense of importance and urgency to maintain the trust of the general public in the state institutions. He also invited the attention of the D.G. Pakistan Post to a complaint from the WMS, Regional Office, Multan to the effect that neither progress reports were being submitted by the Post Office Department nor any representative of the Agency was attending the hearings held in that office in the context of public complaints. He invited the D.G. Pakistan Post to present an overall perspective of the current status of delivery of mandated services to the general public and the constraints, if any, being faced by the Post Office Deptt.
- Pakistan have so far been digitalized whereas the work on the remaining GPOs was in hand. However, he expressed his inability to indicate any time frame for completion of the digitalization scheme. Citing the inadequacy of staff and capacity issues, he also pointed out some other constraints such as lack of access to soft loan for the purpose of computerization and digitalization of the postal services system in Pakistan and to carry out the reform agenda. He emphasized that the problems of hardware and software were restricting the implementation of the reform agenda for which the assistance and support of the Ministry of Communications would be necessary. Explaining the background and the difficulties being faced in the process of upgrading the profit posting procedures, he highlighted the steps being taken in coordination with the HBL.

- The meeting was also informed that:-
 - > The complaints that were earlier being handled at the level of D.G are now being dealt with at the unit level which has reduced the time lag.
 - > The follow up meetings with the concerned quarters are being held for the purpose of timely posting of profit of the account holders. The last such meeting was held on Thursday, 3
- > Tracking system of articles that are categorized as accountable documents is functioning
- > An agreement has been signed with the HBL and their platform would be used for the

- > A number of problems have cropped up with the HBL in regard to digitalization process in the context of the FATF requirements; and opening of new accounts has been stopped by



- (b) for rule 353, the following shall be substituted, namely:-
 - '353. A declaration in revised Form T.R. 40 shall be obtained yearly from pensioners whose pension is terminable by their marriage or re-marriage and shall be attached to the bills for pension paid for September, however, this requirement shall be dispensed with after attaining by the pensioner the age of sixty years';
- for rule 368, the following shall be substituted, namely :-

'368. In all cases referred to in rules 342, 343 and 348, the disbursing officer must take special precautions to prevent impositions and must, at least once a year, receive proof of life or proof of continued existence of the pensioner, through NADRA's biometric verification at any branch of a bank maintaining his pension account, which shall be conclusive proof of the continued existence of the pensioner. Any pensioner who is incapacitated by bodily illness or infirmity from so going to any branch of a bank for biometric verification or whose finger prints no longer exist due to old age or infirmity or a genetic condition, that pensioner shall give written request for exemption and for that pensioner, the disbursing officer shall allow proof of life through life certificate as conclusive proof of his continued existence. The disbursing officer shall be responsible for any payment wrongly made and in all cases of doubt, he must consult the Accountant General.

Note - A pensioner of rank may be privately identified by the disbursing officer and disbursing office. disbursing officer and need not be required to appear at the
