## Part-II

### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

**I. CIVIL MISC. APPLICATION NO. 10275 OF 2019 AND CIVIL APPEAL NO. 571 OF 2020 FILED BY PAKISTAN POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT AGAINST THE JUDGMENT DATED 11-09-2019, PASSED BY THE FST ISLAMABAD IN APPEAL NO. 50 (R) CS/2018 FILED BY MR. AZHAR HUSSAIN.**

Supreme Court of Pakistan while deciding the Civil Misc. Application No. 10275 of 2019 and Civil Appeal No. 571 of 2020 filed by Pakistan Post Office Department against the judgment dated 11-09-2019 passed by the FST Islamabad in appeal No. 50 (R) CS/2018 filed by Mr. Azhar Hussain has held that the respondent was required to pass the examination, which he failed to do in two chances provided to him. Thus, we find no illegality in the order of discharge from service of the respondent. In such view of the matter, the impugned judgment is not legally sustainable, the same is set aside and the appeal is allowed as respondent was appointed as junior Accountant (BPS-12) on 26-02-2008 and according to Rule 696 (40 of Post Office Manual Vol-IV, on completion of training, the probationary Junior Accountants will be required to pass Part I of the Post Office Accountants Examination as per prescribed syllabus. A Probationer will be allowed two chances for clearing the examination failing which he will be discharged from service after giving him a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken against him.

2. In the light of above, he was issued show cause notice dated 09-08-2017 on the plea that he has available two chances for clearing Part-I examination for the post of Junior Accountant in 2009 and 2013 but did not pass the same. The respondent appears to have given his reply to the show cause notice in which he has admitted the fact that he has not been able to pass the said examination and requested that he may be allowed another chance. The appellant did not agree with the request of the respondent and proceeded to pass the order dated 19-10-2017 by which he was discharged from service under the rules. The respondent filed departmental appeal and thereafter, service appeal before the Federal Service Tribunal, Islamabad. The tribunal vide the judgment dated 11-09-2019 accepted the appeal and appellant is reinstated into service with effect from the date of impugned order with all consequential service benefits as per law.

3. In this regard copy of judgments in Civil Misc. Application No. 1025 of 2019 and Civil Appeal No. 571 of 2020 filed by Pakistan Post Office Department against the judgment dated 11-09-2019 passed by the FST Islamabad in appeal No. 50 (R) CS/2018 filed by Mr. Azhar Hussain is enclosed for circulation with the direction that cases of similar nature may be decided in the light of the order of the supreme Court of Pakistan to avoid unnecessary litigation.

**ORDER**

**GULZAR AHMED, CJ.-** We have heard the learned Additional Attorney General for Pakistan so also Respondent No.1 (the Respondent), who has appeared in person.

2. The respondent was appointed as Junior Accountant (BPS-12) on 26.02.2008. The very appointment letter provided that the respondent will remain on probation for a period of one year during which time his proficiency, his working and conduct will be judged by the supervisor. The respondent completed the probationary period and thereafter, through letter dated 26.07.2011, his post was upgraded from

Manual Vol-IV and in terms of appointment as prescribed in appendix No.26 of Post Office Manual Vol-IV with immediate effect. The respondent filed departmental appeal and thereafter, service appeal before the Federal Service Tribunal, Islamabad (the Tribunal). The Tribunal vide the impugned judgment dated 11.09.2019 came to the conclusion that part-1 examination was the very requirement for promotion from BPS-12, which was not necessary for the respondent to pass when he had been up-graded from BPS-12 to BPS-16 and thus, order of discharge could not be made. In doing so, the Tribunal did not at all examine the above mentioned rule, more so, the rules which were specifically mentioned in the letter by which the respondent's service was discharged. For ease of reference such rule is reproduced as below:-

"(4) On completion of training, the Probationary Junior Accountants will be required to pass Part I of the Post Office Accountants Examination as per prescribed syllabus. A Probationer will be allowed two chances for clearing the examination failing which he will be discharged from service after giving him a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken against him."

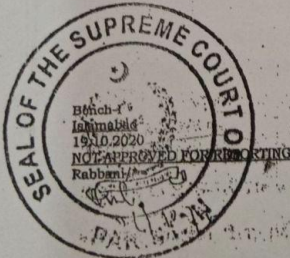

3. The respondent was confronted with this rule and he admitted before us that he has not been able to pass the said examination. The consequence of non-passing of the said examination is very well mentioned in the rule itself, in that, after issuance of show cause notice order of discharge will be passed. Such having been done by the appellant and we see no reason as to why such discharge from service of the respondent could not be made, when he has failed to clear Part-I examination for the post of Junior Accountant in two chances provided to him. Thus, we note that the Tribunal when passing the impugned judgment did not consider the rules and their legal implication and passed the impugned judgment, which apparently, is not in accordance with law.

4. The respondent was required to pass the examination, which he failed to do in two chances provided to him. Thus, we find no illegality in the order of discharge from service of the respondent. In such view of the matter, the impugned judgment is not legally sustainable, the same is set aside and the appeal is allowed. The pending CMAs are disposed of.
