DIRECTIONS FOR NOTE

1. A pensioner who cannot sign his bill and can only make a mark should also make an impression of his left-thumb which should always be attested by another person known to the post office.
2. Subscription to Service funds and payments of Life Insurance Companies are exempted from income-tax to the extent of 1/6th of the pension. For payments to Insurance Company, the receipt of the Company should be attached to the bill.
3. A pensioner specially exempted by the competent authority from personal appearance, a female pensioner not accustomed to appear in public, or a male pensioner who is unable to appear in consequence of bodily illness or infirmity, may receive his or her pension upon the production of a life certificate signed by a responsible officer of Government, or by some other well-known trustworthy person.
4. A pensioner on any description who produces a life certificate signed by some person exercising the powers of a Magistrate under the Criminal Procedure Code, or by any Registrar or Sub-Registrar under the Registration Act, or by any Pensioned Officer who, before retirement exercise the powers of a Magistrate, or by a Chaplain or any Gazetted Officer of Government, or by any person holding a Government title, is exempted from personal appearance.
5. The pensioner is required to attend personally at least once a year unless he is incapacitated on account of bodily illness or infirmity in which case independent proof thereof should be furnished.
